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The MyTec service will be available starting on January 23, 2012.

MyTec is the MTSD service that will allow students, staff and guests wireless access to the Internet on their personal technology device(s). It is the expectation that any technology device being used at school will be used for **educational purposes**.

The purpose of the **MyTec** wireless service is to provide a 21st Century learning environment that mirrors students' off-campus world while maximizing instructional time and tools, creating collaboration and networking opportunities, and meeting the learning styles and needs of students.

More information can be found in the **MyTec Guide** which is posted on the main district website under **Parents**. The **MyTec Guide** includes **Frequently Asked Questions** sections for **Students, Staff** and **Parents**. Please read the guide before bringing technology devices to school.

Below are a few important items to keep in mind:

- 1) Any technology device brought to school is the student's responsibility. The MTSD and individual schools are not and will not be responsible for theft or damage to a student's technology device. But, if a technology device is damaged or stolen, immediately notify the school's administration so the investigation process can be started.
- 2) Security Suggestions
 - a. Always make sure your technology device is in a secure location.
 - b. Etch or put some other identifier on your technology device.
 - c. Record your technology device's make, model, and serial number.
 - d. Enable your technology device's GPS locator (if it is equipped with one).
- 3) MTSD staff will not be available to assist students in gaining access to the wireless network. It is expected that a student will know how to gain access to the wireless network on his/her technology device. If a student is having trouble gaining access to the wireless network, seeking help from another student will be the most expedient method in resolving the technology issue.
- 4) MTSD staff has the final say as to whether or not the use of a technology device is appropriate in a particular classroom setting. There will be times when the use of a technology device will be counterproductive to the educational process. It is always recommended that a student check with his/her teacher before bringing a technology device to class.
